STARTING FROM WITHIN

- In Unity, We Can Transform Our World
 - The web of our relationships with others and the natural world, which has given rise to the problems we face as a human family, can be changed.
- **Development Comes From Within**
 - The process of human and community development unfolds from within each person, relationship, family organization, community or nation.
- Vision Is Necessary For Development
 A vision of who we can become and what a sustainable world would be like, works as a powerful magnet, drawing us to our potential.
- Healing Is Necessary For Development
 Healing the past, closing up old wounds and learning healthy habits of thought and action to replace dysfunctional thinking and disruptive patterns of human relations is a necessary part of the process of sustainable development.

WORKING IN A CIRCLE

- Interconnectedness
- Everything is connected to everything else; therefore, any aspect of our healing and development is related to all the others (personal, social, cultural, political, economic, etc.). When we work on any one part, the whole circle is affected.
- Unity Is Necessary For Development Unity means Oneness. Without Unity, the common Oneness that makes (seemingly) separate human beings into 'community' is impossible. Disunity is the primary disease of the community.
- Participation Is Necessary For Development
 Participation is the active engagement of the minds, hearts, and energy of the people in the process of their own healing and development.
- Every person (regardless of gender, orientation, race, age, culture, religion) must be accorded equal opportunity to participate in the process of healing and development and to receive a fair share of the benefits.

IN A SACRED MANNER

Spirit

Human beings are both material and spiritual in nature. It is therefore inconceivable that the human community could become whole and sustainable without bringing our lives into balance with the requirements of our spiritual nature.

Morals And Ethics Sustainable human and community development requires a moral foundation centered on the wisdom of the heart. When this foundation is lost, morals and ethical principles decline and development stop.

The Hurt Of One Is The Hurt Of All: The Honor Of One Is The Honor Of All The basic fact of our oneness as a human family means that development for some at the expense of well being for others is not acceptable or sustainable.

Authentic Development Is Culturally Based Healing and development must be rooted in the wisdom, knowledge and living processes of the culture of the people.

WE HEAL AND DEVELOP OURSELVES, **OUR RELATIONSHIPS AND OUR WORLD**

Human beings are learning beings. We begin learning while we are still in our mother's wombs, and unless something happens to close off our minds and paralyze our capacities, we keep learning throughout our entire lives. Learning is at the core of healing and development.

Sustainability and Abundance

To sustain something means to enable it to continue for a long time. Authentic development does not use up or undermine what it needs to keep on going. To be able to inherently know and feel that every action and step we take in our physical and spiritual lives, allow for the abundant flow of the power of Nature, without any disharmony to our environment and to each other. As we harness the energy, for our usage, we co-create ways to give back more than we take; through intention, prayer, contemplation, and nurturing the seeds we sow.

Move To The Positive

Solving the critical problems in our lives and communities is best approached by visualizing and moving into the positive alternative that we wish to create, and by building on the strengths we already have, rather than giving away our energy, by fighting the negative.

Be The Change You Want To See








Indigenous Wellness Framework



The Earth Charter (1987)

- 1. Respect Earth and life in all its diversity.
 - Recognize that all beings are interdependent and every form of life has value regardless of its worth to human beings.
 - Affirm faith in the inherent dignity of all human beings and in the intellectual, artistic, ethical, and spiritual potential of humanity.
- 2. Care for the community of life with understanding, compassion, and love.
 - Accept that with the right to own, manage, and use natural resources comes the duty to prevent environmental harm and to protect the rights of people.
 - Affirm that with increased freedom, knowledge, and power comes increased responsibility to promote the common good.
- 3. Build democratic societies that are just, participatory, sustainable, and peaceful.
 - 1. Ensure that communities at all levels guarantee human rights and fundamental freedoms and provide everyone an opportunity to realize his or her full potential.
 - Promote social and economic justice, enabling all to achieve a secure and meaningful livelihood that is ecologically responsible.
- 4. Secure Earth's bounty and beauty for present and future generations.
 - 1. Recognize that the freedom of action of each generation is qualified by the needs of future generations.
 - Transmit to future generations values, traditions, and institutions that support the long-term flourishing of Earth's human and ecological communities.



Capital Institute's Eight Principles

The human economy is a living system (albeit an unhealthy one today).

There are universal patterns and principles – "first principles" – we can define that broadly describe the qualities and tendencies of how life works.

If the human economy is to be sustainable over the long run, it must harness the regenerative process by aligning with these same "first principles" of living systems.

Engaging in Social and Political Transformation: More sustainable ways of living will require the support of a more conscious democracy and vibrant civil society from which more enlightened leaders will emerge. All individuals should be encouraged to use their gifts to create participatory, responsible and compassionate models of governance.

Working for Integrity in Commerce: Conscious businesses that are aware of the scope, depth, and long-range impacts of their actions are key to achieving austainability. Business must become an ethical steward of the Earth's ecology and consciously establish an economic basis for a future of equitably shared abundance.

Promoting Health and Healing: The science of mind-body-spirit health has demonstrated the profound connection between the health of a whole person and the health of the system in which he or she lives. Whole systems healing, respecting both traditional knowledge and modern sciences, must be supported in physical, social, and spiritual domains.

Building Global Community: The new story is about all of us who share this planet. Together, we can create a culture of peace that eliminates the need for armed conflict, respecting and appreciating the glorious diversity of our human family.

The Nine Points of Agreement Among the World's Religions (1984–2007)

- 1. The world religions bear witness to the experience of Ultimate Reality to which they give various names: Brahma, Allah, (the) Absolute, God, Great Spirit.
- 2. Ultimate Reality cannot be limited by any name or concept.
- 3. Ultimate Reality is the ground of infinite potentiality and actualization.
- 4. Faith is opening, accepting, and responding to Ultimate Reality. Faith in this sense precedes every belief system.
- 5. The potential for human wholeness—or in other frames of reference, enlightenment, salvation, transformation, blessedness, nirvana—is present in every human.
- 6. Ultimate Reality may be experienced not only through religious practices but also through nature, art, human relationships, and service to others.
- 7. As long as the human condition is experienced as separate from Ultimate Reality, it remains subject to ignorance, illusion, weakness, and suffering.
- 8. Disciplined practice is essential to the spiritual life; yet spiritual attainment isn't the result of one's own efforts, but the result of the experience of oneness (unity) with Ultimate Reality.
- 9. Prayer is communion with Ultimate Reality, whether it's regarded as personal, impersonal (transpersonal), or beyond both.1



Barbara Marx Hubbard's Wheel of Co-Creation [1998-2012]

The 7 S's of Co-creation by Barbara Marx Hubbard

- 1. Syntony: attunement with the patterns of creation experienced as one's own inner motivation and
- 2. Synergy: the coming together of separate parts to form a new whole different from, greater than and unpredictable from the sum of its parts.
- 3. Synchronicity: the apparent a-causal relationship among events; coincidences that could not be planned by human mind but that appear to flow from a larger and more comprehensive design.
- 4. Suprasex: the passion to express unique creativity, stimulated by vocational arousal, comparable to sexuality at the next level; instead of joining genes to procreate, we join genius to co-create - to give birth to our greater Self and to our work in the world.
- 5. Syntropy: nature's tendency to form whole systems of greater complexity, consciousness and freedom; evolution's tendency to optimize.
- 6. Spontaneity: the experience of unpremeditated action and thought that flows naturally without thinking or planning; action that is on the mark, which facilitates and coordinates life.

7. Self-creativity: the tendency in nature to organize itself; autopoesis; the inherent capacity in nature to self-organize without apparent outside manipulation, springing from the field of Universal Intelligence out of which everything is arising.

Break free of your "monkey-mind" and get in touch with the Sage within, Spirit, God. Create a white canvas and dream onto it a world of beauty and arace.





- 7.All information is available to all members all the time. We honor and encourage transparency in our communications. Honesty, integrity and respect are of the highest value.











Learning is embedded in memory, history, and story.


Learning involves patience and time.
